Blidinje Nature Park

It is located in Bosnia and Herzegovina in the area of the central Dinarides and includes the mountain massifs of Čvrsnica and Vran. Administratively, it is part of the municipalities of Posušje, Tomislavgrad, Prozor-Rama, Jablanica and the city of Mostar. Due to its special geographical, herbal and animal attributes, on 30. March 1995 Blidinje was declared a nature park. In this unique natural area, which contains many endemic species of flora and fauna, around 1,500 plant species have been recorded to date. The park contains the largest habitat of the endemic white-barked munika pine.

SIGNIFICANT SITES AND ATTRACTIONS

Blidinje Lake

lidinje Lake is the largest mountain lake in Bosnia and Herzegovina and is a geomorphological nature monument after which the park got its name. The surface of the lake is from 3 to 6 km² with a relatively shallow depth of half a meter to a maximum of four meters. The lake itself is located between the Vran and Čvrsnica mountains, at the bottom of Dugo polje, at an altitude of 1184 m. With its unreal natural beauty, Blidinje Lake perfectly complements the landscape of

the Blidinje Nature Park. It is a real lure for nature lovers, both in summer and in winter. During sunny summer days, when the wind calms the restless water of Blidinje Lake, a real fairy tale is staged in the lake because the entire landscape is perfectly reflected in it, which gives the eye of the observer another new dimension of experience. During the winter period, due to low temperatures, most of the lake freezes and an attractive ice surface is created.











BLIDINJE NATURE PARK

called "hajduci" which are a symbol of the Blidinje region. According to the legend, men who joined the band of hajduk Mijat Tomić had to go through Hajdučka Vrata to make themselves bulletproof. From there the name Hajdučka Vrata originates, and some also call it "Mijatov prolaz". The circle is made of rocks and has a diameter of five meters. It is located at 2000 m above sea level and has a view down the which descends into Diva Grabovica canyon, an incredible 1800m. The easiest way to get to Hajdučka Vrata is from the direction of Vitlenica/Muharnica. The climb takes about 3.5/4 hours and is characterized as a medium difficulty climb. Near the track is also the mountain lodge

Vilinac and one shelter called Zaglavlje which can be useful in situations when the weather worsens. Hajdučka Vrata is visited by thousands of tourists every year, which results in excellent promotion of this whole region which with its exceptional beauty becomes more and more recognizable around the world. Hajdučka Vrata are very fragile and sensitive, and it is not recommended to stand directly below them, but a few meters in front of them. It is necessary to make sure that everything people bring with them to the mountains, is also brought back to where it came from leaving no waste in the nature.



Čvrsnica and Vran -Herzegovinian mountain giants

🚵 ome call Čvrsnica «the roof of Herzegovina» because of its height. With its highest peak, Pločno, at 2,228 meters above sea level, it represents the highest mountain in the central Dinarides. The massif of Čvrsnica, which has two mountain ranges, four plateaus, and 15 peaks over 2,000 meters above sea level, is protected as part of the Blidinje Nature Park. Its special natural phenomenon - Hajdučka Vrata - has been protected as a natural monument since 1985. Despite all the beauty that can be seen on this mountain, it's worth highlighting why this mountain is a favorite for many. It is home to the Vilinac Mountain Lodge, which is considered the highest mountain lodge in the entire Dinarides. Veliki Kuk is a part of Čvrsnica where the largest vertical drop in the Balkans is located. The cliffs of Veliki Kuk are an incredible 1,300 meters high, and standing on their edges is an unparalleled feeling. Čvrsnica also has its own canyon that it has carved out, known as the Diva Grabovica Canyon, which is 1,800 meters deep. A breathtaking, wild, and powerful mountain of unreal beauty - it attracts a large number of hikers and mountaineers throughout all seasons.

ran is another stunning mountain of Herzegovina, which forms the backbone of the Blidinje Nature Park. Intertwined with history carved by both nature and human hands, with its highest peak at 2,074 meters above sea level (Veliki Vran), it also belongs to the Herzegovinian mountain giants. Its beauty and uniqueness will inspire you to respectfully traverse through its heights and plateaus. Along with the highest peak, three other peaks exceed the 2,000 meters above sea level mark. Both mountains have very good hiking trails which branch out to their most beautiful and most inaccessible parts.







Hajduk Mijat Tomić's Cave

he Cave of Hajduk Mijat Tomić is located on Dugo Polje, at the foot of the Vran mountain and in close proximity to the restaurant Hajdučke Vrleti. It is interesting both historically and due to the fauna inhabiting it. It has been the subject of numerous speleological explorations and analyses. According to the legend, Mijat Tomić stayed in these parts in the mid-17th century and marked the distant past with his bravery and fearlessness. Legend has it that the cave has an exit to the other side of Vran, towards Rama.





Stećci in the Blidinje Nature Park

n the area of the Blidinje Nature Park, on two large necropolises and several other different locations, there are medieval stone sleepers - Christian tombstones from the period between the 12th and 14th centuries; stećci, which with their beauty and history defy oblivion and testify to us about some other bygone times. The Dugo Polje necropolis is on the list of 30 medieval stećak necropolises that were declared UNESCO World Heritage Sites in 2016. They are located in the municipality of Jablanica, on the way to Kedžara. The necropolis consists of 150 stećci, most of which are slabs and chests, and some stećci are decorated. The stećci are in good condition and are one of the most important cultural landmarks in the Blidinje Nature Park.














Franciscan House of Prayer

The Franciscan House of Prayer is located in the heart of the Blidinje Nature Park on the slopes of Mount Čvrsnica, in Masna Luka, at an altitude of 1204 meters above sea level. It is the result of centuries-old love of the friars of the Herzegovinian Franciscan Province and their care for these areas and the people who inhabit them. In the past, they were shepherds with their flocks, and in recent decades, they have been mostly individuals who come to the mountains to rest their bodies and find their souls. In 1982, friar Petar Krasić began the construction of a so-called standing house intended for the stay of friars serving in the St. Francis Chaplaincy. The Franciscan House of Prayer in Masna Luka abounds in springs, small lakes, underground waters, and marshes. Among the springs,

the most famous and interesting is the Jasle spring, located in the immediate vicinity of the church and monastery, enriching ponds and marshes below with its water. The Jasle spring serves as a retreat for those brothers who withdraw for their annual spiritual exercises. Over time, friar Petar also built a beautiful church of St. Elijah with a unique bell tower (2005) and a house (2015) that accommodates those in need of spiritual refreshment. The entire complex is a harmonious entity that, with its architecture, perfectly and unobtrusively blends into the natural environment. As part of the Franciscan House of Prayer in Masna Luka, priests organize various spiritual programs throughout the year, combining prayer, socializing, and hiking. Each generation can find something for themselves.















Diva Grabovica Canyon

ne of the most beautiful parts of Čvrsnica on its southeastern side is represented by Diva Grabovica; a river and a grandiose canyon with a depth of up to 1800 meters and over 6 kilometers in length. Hiking through this part of Čvrsnica will provide you with an unforgettable experience and a true enjoyment of the fairytale-like beauty of the mountain landscapes. Climbing through this canyon will reveal to you entirely new beauties of the Čvrsnica mountain massif and allow you to experience the wilderness of nature. The best choice of route for hiking in this area starts from Grabovica itself, 35 kilometers north of Mostar, along the Neretva Canyon. Your journey also depends on your desires and those of the mountaineers.

The markings in the Diva Grabovica Canyon will lead you to Žlijeb, Tisa, Plasa over Strmenica to Hajdučka Vrata and from there further to Veliki Vilinac, Pločno, or you can decide to cross the entire mountain via Veliki Vilinac and descend to Masna Luka. From the canyon to the high peaks of Čvrsnica, you can climb using Via Ferrata that leads you under the cliffs of Veliki Kuk and whose starting point is next to a place where Bracin Bivak is located. The entire canyon is full of steep ascents, making it an excellent place for mountaineering preparations for major expeditions worldwide. Adding to all this is the fact that the trail from the bottom of the canyon through Strmenica over Veliki Vilinac to Masna Luka is one of the most challenging hiking trails in the Balkans.





Veliki Kuk

iking trails lead to incredible places and beautiful viewpoints. One such trail leads to the highest cliff in the Balkan Peninsula. Veliki Kuk is the most rugged area of Čvrsnica. Its cliffs plunge steeply down an incredible 1300 meters into the valley of Diva Grabovica, creating breathtaking sights that leave no one indifferent. The cliffs of Veliki Kuk stand shoulder to shoulder with the highest cliffs in the world and are a true pride of the Blidinje Nature Park. A marked hiking trail leads to the very edge of the cliffs, and the easiest way to reach this point is by taking the trail to the Vilinac Mountain Lodge. From the mountain hut to the cliffs of Veliki Kuk, it takes an additional hour of hiking, and besides this ascent to the

peaks of the cliffs, you can also reach them directly from the Diva Grabovica Canyon. From the starting point in the canyon, where you head towards Žlijeb, you can also hike to Veliki Kuk. There is a marked trail, and in some parts, it is marked as a Via Ferrata, i.e., a secured mountaineering route. Standard equipment required for Via Ferrata passage is necessary for such an ascent. Veliki Kuk is a special place - standing at the edges of cliffs that seem endless and watching birds fly "below you" is an extraordinary sight. From the same spot, the entire Diva Grabovica Canyon can be viewed as if in the palm of your hand, allowing you to explore every corner. The most isolated part of Čvrsnica, named Peštibrdo, is also very close, so this part can also be experienced.









n the Blidinje Nature Park, over 1500 different plant species have been recorded, earning it the title of the Herzegovinian developmental endemic center and making it unique at the European level due to its exceptional richness. The incredible floral richness is the result of the ecological heterogeneity of the area, as well as its climatic, hydrological, and geomorphological diversity. The vast majority of the park is covered by forests, while the rest consists of meadows and pastures. Various plants found here are Illyrian, Balkan, and Dinaric endemics. It is remarkable that 40% of stenoendemics recorded in Bosnia and Herzegovina are found in the park, along with over 200 endemic, subendemic, and relict plant species. Throughout the different seasons, visitors can find an abundance of medicinal and aromatic herbs, allowing them to enjoy the medicinal benefits of the natural wealth of this park every year. Given that the park stretches from 1000 to 2228 meters above sea level, the diversification of flora

is evident, and the vertical stratification of vegetation is clearly visible.

FOREST VEGETATION

In the lower forested area of Blidinje, krš forests of oriental hornbeam (*Carpinus orientalis*) dominate, along with the endemic Tilovina (*Petteria ramentacea*), which holds great biological and economic significance. Tilovina is an endemic species of the karst area, rare in the flora of Bosnia and Herzegovina, and significant in beekeeping due to its nectar-bearing properties. Adjacent to the hornbeam for-ests are downy oak forests (*Quercus pubescens*), characterized by a high degree of diversity, where we can find endemic species such as Lillium cattanie and Crocus dalmaticus.

In the mountain forests, beech (Fagetum montane) is found, the most economical-ly and floristically significant forest community. A large number of endemic, relict, and sensitive species are recorded within the fir



community (Avieti fagetum). In the southern and western parts of Čvrsnica and in the east and southeast of Vran, a distinct system of conifer zonation is found as a result of post-glacial zonation. Among them, it is important to highlight the Bosnian pine (Pinus heldreichii var. leucodermis), a relict, Balkan-Apennine endemic.

In the montane vegetation belt, beech forests (Fagetum montane) are present, one of the most economically important and floristically richest forest communities. In contrast, the subalpine beech forest community (Fagetum subalpinum) develops under slightly less favorable habitat conditions and with lower floristic di-versity. In the montane vegetation belt, there is also the beech and fir forest community (Abieti - Fagetum), also among the richest forest communities, with a large proportion of endemic, relict, and sensitive species of Bosnia and Herze-govina, such as the sensitive species Lilium martagon. Black pine (Pinus nigra) forest communities develop at slightly higher elevations and represent remnants of old, more widespread, pre-glacial forests. They are characterized by a high proportion of relict species in the floristic composition and, as a result of post-glacial zonation, form a distinct system of conifer zonation on the southern and western slopes of Čvrsnica and on the eastern and southeastern slopes of Vran. Among the

forest species, it is particularly important to highlight the Bosnian pine (*Pinus heldreichii var. leucodermis*), a relict, Balkan-Apennine endemic. In the cen-ter of the park in Masna Luka, there is a Bosnian pine reserve, which is the largest such complex in Europe.

NON-FOREST VEGETATION

Mountain meadows and rocky outcrops constitute primary natural and secondary anthropogenic communities dominated by grasses and sedges. A large number of plant species inhabiting these habitats of extreme ecological conditions are rare, endemic, and relict species, which constitute an important gene pool of this park. The rich and diverse vegetation of this area has been greatly influenced by its inhabitants. For centuries, they cleared forests, engaged in agricultural activities, and fertilized these areas with their livestock, all of which affect biodiversity. Additionally, new plant varieties have been introduced into the nature park under human influence. In the vegetation of moist meadows located in the lowlands of the park in karst fields, endemic species such as Chouardia litardierei and Edraianthus dalmaticus can be found. On the other hand. in dry meadows and rocky areas influenced by the sub-Mediterranean climate, an endemic species Sternbergia colchiciflora var. dalmatica occurs.

GENTIAN

Gentian, also known as yellow gentian (Latin: Gentiana lutea L. Gentianaceae), is a highly significant plant in the Blidinje Nature Park. It is the most sought-after and popular medicinal plant among the local population. Gentian can be found in mountainous rocky areas on limestone substrates, along forest edges, most commonly in the subalpine vegetation belt. Its flowers are yellow, and the stem is upright, growing to heights ranging from 50 to 150 cm. This plant has a very bitter taste.

ALPINE BEARBERRY

Alpine bearberry (Latin: Arctostaphylos alpinus) is a deciduous shrub from the heather family. Its branches are slender and creeping, with dark brown bark, and its fruits are round, fleshy smooth berries that turn red when ripe. It is called bearberry or bear grape because bears allegedly enjoy eating it. Bearberry can be found on the highest peaks on limestone rocks and is very rare in the Dinaric Alps.

FREYN'S CARNATION

Freyn's carnation, or Freyn's clove (Latin: Dianthus freynii Vandas), is a native endemic species of the Herzegovinian karst, belonging to the Caryophillaceae family. It can be found at altitudes ranging from 1900 to 2228 meters above sea level. This stenoendemic species can be found on Čyrsnica.

EDELWEISS

Edelweiss (Latin: Leontopodium) is a perennial genus belonging to the Compositae family, comprising about 60 species. In the Herzegovina region, mountain or karst edelweiss grows. Its habitat includes mountainous rocky areas and crevices in carbonate rocks. It represents a symbol of mountains and is a highly attractive plant.



PRENJSKA OŠTRICA

Oxytropis prenja or Prenjska oštrica (Latin: Oxytropis prenja), is a plant of the Papilionaceae family - legumes. This endemic species is generally widespread throughout the Dinaric Alps, particularly in the highest zone of Herzegovinian high mountains built of limestone rocks (from about 1900 to 2228 meters above sea level).

HERZEGOVINA BELLFLOWER

Herzegovina bellflower (Latin:
Campanula hercegovina) is a plant of
the Campanulaceae family - bellflowers.
They are found in crevices of vertical
shaded limestone rocks, on average
from 1150 to 1500 meters above sea
level (interestingly, in the Dive Grabovica
canyon, it is found at 240 meters above
sea level). This endemic species is known
from the following locations: the Neretva
canyon, Rakitnica, Diva Grabovica,
Drežnica, and mountains such as Prenj,
Čvrsnica, Čabulja, Plasa, and Velež.

MOUNTAIN YARROW

Mountain yarrow (Latin: Achillea abrotanoides) is a herbaceous perennial flower from the Asteraceae family. It is most commonly found in the subalpine region on limestone screes, among rocky blocks or scree slopes. It is found in elevations ranging from 1200 to 2000 meters above sea level. In folk tradition, this plant is also called Hajdučka trava or kunica, and it is a popular medicinal herb used for making teas or brandies.



VELECVJETNI DIVOKOZJAK

Velecvjetni divokozjak (Latin: Doronicum grandiflorum) is a perennial herbaceous plant from the Asteraceae family. It can grow up to 150cm in height. Its habitat includes rocky terrain around snow patches in sinkholes and in the subalpine and alpine zones.

SPRING CROCUS

Spring Crocus or Saffron (Latin: Crocus neapolitanus) is a perennial plant species with underground corms from the Iridaceae family. Saffron was used by ancient Greeks, Egyptians, and Romans as a spice and a dye for textiles and walls. It is found in deciduous and mixed forests, shrubs, along forest edges, and in meadows. It grows in fresh, nutrient-rich locations

ILLYRIAN GLADIOLUS

Illyrian Gladiolus (Latin: Gladiolus illyricus) is a bulbous perennial plant from the iris family. Over 280 species grow across parts of Eurasia and Africa. Its habitats

include dry rocky meadows from lowlands to hillside vegetation belts.

IRIS REICHENBACHII

Bosnian Iris (Latin: Iris reichenbachii) is a plant from the Iridaceae family (irises) and is an endemic species to Bosnia and Herzegovina. It is a perennial and tall plant. It is found individually or in larger numbers. It commonly inhabits dry meadows and pastures on limestone and serpentine rocks, with shallow skeletal soil.

WILDLIFE

Blidinje Nature Park is not only known for its diverse and rich plant life but also for the wildlife that adorns the mountain peaks, forests, and lakes. It is a sanctuary for various species, and we believe it is crucial to emphasize the importance of respecting and preserving their habitat. The general rule applies that wild animals should not be approached or interacted with, to avoid disturbing them or encouraging dangerous behaviors. It is forbidden to scare, feed, or otherwise disturb the animals. Some animals in the park pose a risk to visitors, and it is the responsibility of everyone to adopt the necessary precautionary measures to mitigate any potential risks. For the safety and protection of the wild inhabitants, it is imperative that no waste or other objects are left in nature within the Blidinje Nature Park.

In the Blidinje Nature Park, there are a large number of plant species recorded, of which 200 are endemic, subendemic, or relict species.

CHAMOIS

The chamois (Latin: Rupicapra rupicapra) has been classified as a rare and protected wild animal since the end of the 19th century. It can grow up to 80 cm in height, with a length of about 130 cm, while larger males weigh more than 40 kg. Females are slightly smaller and lighter. Their natural enemy is the wolf, and for the young, danger can also come from eagles. Chamois can live up to 20 years. They adorn the peaks of Čvrsnica in Blidinje.

WESTERN CAPERCAILLIE

The Western capercaillie (Latin: Tetrao urogallus) is a species of forest bird belonging to the grouse order. They have a distinctive appearance, with bright black-green feathers. Males and females differ in appearance, with the male's plumage being more striking, especially during the mating season. They can weigh up to 5 kilograms and grow up to 85 centimeters in length.



BROWN BEAR

The brown bear (Latin: Ursus arctos), a rare and protected species from the bear family, was almost exterminated from Western Europe. Today, it is found in Central and Eastern Europe as well as Scandinavia. As part of the BEAR IN MIND project, 6 brown bears have been tagged with telemetry collars in Blidinje.

OŠTRULJA

The dace, or Aulopyge (Latin: Aulopyge huegelli), is a freshwater fish from the carp family (Latin: Cyprinidae). It is endemic to Bosnia and Herzegovina and Croatia, being the only representative of the Aulopyge genus in the world. It lives in karst sinkholes, and in winter, when the surface waters freeze, it migrates to dark





underground habitats. It is named after the hard spine with a serrated inner edge in its dorsal fin. It grows up to 20 cm in length.

MOUNTAIN VIPER

The mountain viper, or Vipera ursinii macrops (Latin: Vipera ursinii macrops), is the smallest venomous snake found in Europe and is an endemic species of the Dinaric Alps. Like the common adder and the nose-horned viper, it has a zigzag pattern on its back, which can range from pale brown, gray, or yellow with a dark pattern. The venom of this snake is weaker compared to other European vipers, similar to a bee or wasp sting, but sensitive individuals may experience significant pain and dizziness.

PRENJ MOUNTAIN **SALAMANDER**

The Prenj mountain salamander, or Black salamander (Latin: Salamandra atra), is an amphibian from the salamander genus. It has a stout body with four equally short legs and a long tail. Its skin is slimy and monochromatic, usually black, grayish, or brown. They are found in cold, moist mountain habitats.

SHORT-TOED SNAKE EAGLE

The Short-toed snake eagle (Latin: Circaetus gallicus) is a medium-sized bird of prey from the hawk family. It can reach up to 67cm in length, with a wingspan between 170-185cm. They weigh from 1.2kg to 2.3kg. They are found in dry rocky scrubland of plains and mountains. Generally, they are very quiet and can live up to 17 years.

BLEAK

The Bleak (Latin: Leucaspius delineatus) is a fish from the carp family Cyprinidae. It is also known as the freshwater sprat, the sunbleak, or the blue sprat. Its coloration depends on the characteristics of the water and the bottom; in clearer water, the bleak is lighter, while in lakes and other stagnant waters, it is darker. It has large, well-defined fan-shaped fins. It grows up to 9 cm in length.

TORNJAK

The Tornjak (Latin: Canis montanus) is a mountain livestock quardian dog whose role has been to protect herds from raiders and large predators such as wolves and bears since the 11th century. Its name comes from the word "tor," which means an enclosed space for sheep. Adult dogs are 60-75cm tall and weigh between 40 and 60kg. The Tornjak is considered a resident of Blidinje as it has been guarding herds in these areas for centuries.

Here, you can rent bicycles and experience a true cycling adventure in the beautiful Blidinje Nature Park. VILLAGE OLYMPICS IN BLIDINJE NATURE PARK

In the heart of Masna Luka, under the canopy of white-bark pine trees, which are themselves a treat for the soul and body, you can enjoy the best company with old games forgotten in the world, but preserved in Blidinje, cherished, and organized for visitors. In the organized campsite in front of the Mountaineering Lodge Masna Luka and the Visitor Center, the Village Olympics take place. The campsite has all the necessities for a safe stay in nature. It has a part with dense tree cover that provides shade during summer. There is a source of clear mountain water in the camp, and there are meadows that provide space for various activities. Since the camp is close to these two superb facilities, toilets are always accessible, and there's even a mini zip-line for the youngest. The Village Olympics in Blidinje Nature Park consist of five disciplines in which

competitors try to use strength and speed, as well as skills that require resourcefulness and agility. These are: standing long jump, sack race, tug-of-war, log wrestling, and sack jumping. The Village Olympics bring excitement, laughter, tense finishes, thrilling twists, competitive spirit, and experiences that are long remembered and recounted.

WINTER SEASON IN BLIDINJE NATURE PARK AND SKIING

Within the Blidinje Nature Park, on the slopes of Čvrsnica, the ski and recreational center "Risovac" is located. Spread across an area of 30,000 m², it features several ski slopes and two ski lifts. One of them is a quad chairlift manufactured by Doppelmeyr, with a capacity of 1942 persons/hour and a length of 929 m. Its starting point is at an altitude of 1293 m, and the destination is at 1548 m; the ride takes approximately 6 minutes. In addition to the quad chairlift, there is also a small tow lift, a Doppelmeyr ski lift with a capacity of 563 persons/hour and a length of 262 m. Its starting point is at an altitude of 1290 m. and the destination is at 1346 m; the ride takes about 2 minutes. For the youngest skiers, there is also a small ski lift for beginners, right next to the small tow lift. Apart from the ski slopes, there is also a toboggan run for the little ones. The Risovac Ski Center also offers skiing lessons for beginners and those who want to improve their skills. Skiing on one of the three slopes equipped with ski lifts and quad chairlifts, with a capacity of approximately 2000 people per hour, or simply enjoying nature in your preferred way, will fill your winter day in our Park. Nothing compares to the beautiful whiteness that envelops the Blidinje area during the winter season. It's wonderful to come to this idullic setting and immerse yourself in the charms of nature; to recreate on the ski slopes or simply take a walk and enjoy the peace and quiet.

CVRSNICA TRAIL RUNNING CAMP

During the summer, the unforgettable threeday Čvrsnica Trail Running Camp offers all participants the experience of running on the Čvrsnica and Vran mountains. The





running is organized into two groups, with the first tailored to trail beginners, covering distances of up to approximately 10 km with a 500 m ascent, offering views of Čvrsnica and its peaks. The second group is designed for more experienced trail runners, with distances of up to approximately 25 km and a 1500 m ascent along the slopes and peaks of Čvrsnica.

Highlander Hercules Blidinje offers the ultimate mountaineering experience where participants from all over Europe and the world can experience the unreal beauty of this park from an altitude of 2000 meters. The adventure spans 91 kilometers of untouched nature in the Blidinje Nature



Park and lasts for five days. Participants have the opportunity to experience a unique circular tour over Čvrsnica and Vran mountains with a view of Blidinjsko Lake. The starting point and finish line are in Masna Luka, a special forest reserve in the heart of the Park. For those for whom five days is too much, it is possible to join Highlander Orion Blidinje, where the beauty of Čvrsnica can be experienced over two days and 30 kilometers, feeling the spirit of Highlander. Through 91 kilometers and over 150,000 steps, both easy and challenging, all participants can experience the most

beautiful parts of this park firsthand. The Hercules and Orion routes are designed to showcase the best of what Blidinje, Vran, and Čvrsnica have to offer. Checkpoints where participants sleep and witness the sunset, as well as greet the sunrise the next morning, are carefully planned and located in breathtaking locations..

CELEBRATION OF DIVA'S DAY

Legend has it that once in this region lived a girl of exceptional beauty named Diva Grabovčeva. Her beauty was noticed by the Turkish Tahir-beg Kopčić, who proposed to her, but she refused to marry him, which ultimately cost her life. Diva became a symbol of purity, martyrdom, and Catholicism. She was buried on Vran mountain, and in 1998, a bronze monument

was erected on her grave, the work of sculptor Kuzma Kovačić. According to ancient tradition in the region of Rama, the first Sunday after the feast of St. Peter and St. Paul is celebrated as "Divin dan," a day dedicated to Diva Grabovčeva. 
BLIDINJE BIKE FESTIVAL

GATHERING OF MOUNTAINEERS IN MASNA LUKA

The mountain idyll in Masna Luka is the ideal location for one of the largest gatherings of mountaineers in the region. The occasion for this traditional gathering is the anniversary of the death of mountaineer Ivica Plazonić from Kaštela, who was tragically lost on Čvrsnica. The memorial gathering was initiated by the Malačka Mountaineering






Society from Kaštela, and soon after, the HPD Pločno from Posušje joined the organization, leading to this event growing into a respected regional mountaineering gathering. Mountaineers, nature lovers, and recreational enthusiasts from all over Bosnia and Herzegovina and the region come to Blidinje to enjoy various organized mountaineering tours and conquer the peaks of the mountains our Park offers. Friendly gatherings, enjoying the campfire, competing in old sports, a rich communal lunch, and participating in the holy mass in Masna Luka are all part of this gathering of mountaineers in our Park, which traditionally takes place on the second weekend of July.

OUR LADY OF THE SNOWS

Every year at the beginning of August, the feast of Our Lady of the Snows is celebrated. In our Park, this day is especially celebrated at Barzonja near Blidinje Lake, where a church dedicated to Our Lady of the Snows is built. This beautiful church with artistic mosaics and a tall bell tower was constructed in 1995 and was opened and blessed on the same day, August 5th. The mass traditionally starts at 12 o'clock, and after the holy mass, there is a gathering of all the assembled faithful. The name Our Lady of the Snows comes from the legend according to which snow fell in Rome in the middle of summer, on August 5th, and according to the testimony of local priests - snow also fell on Blidinje on one of the feast days of Our Lady of the Snows.







BLIDINJE GASTRO FESTIVAL

The Blidinje Gastro Festival is an event aimed at showcasing traditional customs and promoting products from local producers in the Posušje municipality and beyond. It also aims to foster collaboration and networking among exhibitors, with the goal of enhancing the tourism potential of the Posušje, Tomislavgrad, Jablanica, Rama, and surrounding areas. The festival takes place in Masna Luka, a beautiful mountain oasis and the center of the Blidinje Nature Park. It offers a rich selection of local products and handicrafts, as well as activities such as horseback riding and axe throwing. The Blidinje Gastro Festival is held in the autumn months in the Blidinje Nature Park.

ČVRSNICA ULTRA TRAIL

Mountain race in the Blidinje Nature Park where over 170 participants can enjoy the magnificent views of the Čvrsnica and Vran mountains, as well as the natural phenomenon of the Hajdučka Vrata. Runners can challenge themselves on four trails: the Green trail with its 10 kilometers and 380 meters elevation, the Yellow trail with its 25 kilometers and 1500 meters elevation, the Blue trail with its 34 kilometers and 2300 meters elevation, and the Red trail with its 50 kilometers and 4000 meters elevation. Each trail is unique in its own way,

"LIE WELL AND STAY ALIVE"

Organized by the Hajduk Republic of Mijat Tomić, in the Blidinje Nature Park, specifically at the Hajdučke Vrleti restaurant, for more than 20 years now, a lying competition called "Dobro slaži i ostani živ" ("Lie Well and Stay Alive") has been held. The "Council of Liars" decides on the winners, and the most successful ones receive valuable prizes and recognition. A wealth of fun and laughter, a rich program with tamburitza music, and a valuable raffle characterize this special event held on the second Saturday of November.



BLIDINJE WINTER FEST

Blidinje becomes the center of the best New Year's Eve entertainment every year. The largest three-day music event, Blidinje Winter Fest, is held here, attracting numerous visitors each year with well-known musical acts. The three-day music festival takes place in a large tent next to the ski slopes in the Blidinje Nature Park, with a richly decorated interior, heating facilities, and top-notch production and hospitality offerings.

















Associations operating in Blidinje Nature Park and making the area more beautiful and safer

Blidinje Nature Park can be proud of the mountaineering societies operating within the park, as well as its collaboration with the Mountain Rescue Service of Bosnia and Herzegovina. All these societies participate in organizing various events, marking hiking trails, serving as guides for numerous hiking tours, contributing to green projects within Blidinje Nature Park, and much more. The Mountain Rescue Service of Bosnia and Herzegovina is always available to ensure the success of all events or in case of any complications or accidents. Additionally, they actively participate in green projects within Blidinje Nature Park.

MOUNTAINEERING SOCIETY "ORLOVA STINA" TOMISLAVGRAD

On the initiative of a group of enthusiasts, mostly young people passionate about nature, the Mountaineering Society "Orlova Stina" Tomislavgrad was founded on August 30, 1999. Today, the society has a large number of members, manages the Mountaineering Lodge on Blidinje, and actively organizes numerous activities for its members as well as the general public. The Mountaineering Lodge "Blidinje" is located on the shores of Blidinje Lake between the mountain massifs of Vran and Čvrsnica in Blidinie Nature Park at an altitude of 1190 meters. In addition to 36 comfortable beds, the lodge has electricity, water, heating, sanitary facilities with showers, a kitchen, and a barbecue area. In the spacious living room, visitors can relax by the crackling fire from the fireplace and enjoy the view of Blidinje Lake and Čvrsnica.

Traditional ascents, mountaineering schools, expert lectures, various excursions, and social gatherings are just part of the story that

continues the original idea of showcasing all the beauty and splendor of the local mountains to the world. The society maintains over 170 km of hiking trails, ranging from challenging mountain trails to gentle walking paths. In addition to local trails, which are about 10-15 km long, the area managed by this society is crossed by so-called mega hiking trails such as the Via Dinarica and the Path to the Sinj Virgin. The society is open to all citizens, and more than 500 members have joined through it so far. Since its establishment, membership has been steadily increasing, currently numbering 150 individuals. Through various educational programs, the society works on popularizing an active and healthy lifestyle and raising awareness of the positive impact of nature on humans.

HPD PLOČNO

The Mountaineering Society "Pločno" is open to all citizens who wish to become members. In addition to organizing hiking trips, the society aims to organize various environmental actions and participate in activities of general




importance. They own the Mountain Lodge Masna Luka, equipped with all necessary facilities: water, electricity, internet, a mini kitchen, central heating throughout the facility, 21 toilets, and 11 bathrooms. Once completed, the hut will have a restaurant with 160 seats and a kitchen. There is access for all types of vehicles via an asphalt road leading to the lodge, along with ample parking, camping areas, a playground for children, and even a small Zip Line. The hut is heated using biomass, contributing to the cleaning of forests in the Blidinje Nature Park. Solar panels on the roof provide hot water, while wastewater passes through a state-of-the-art bio wastewater treatment system, ensuring that the water discharged is completely clean. The hut operates in line with the "Green Destination" program and does not harm the environment in any way. Via Dinarica has praised it as a good example of best practices. Situated in an ideal location, the hut serves as the starting point for trails leading to Pločno, Veliki Vilinac, and all parts of the Vran Mountain.

HPD PRENJ 1933

The Croatian Mountaineering Society "Prenj 1933" was founded in 1933 in Mostar as a branch of the Mountaineering Association "Matica" Zagreb. The founding assembly consisted of intellectuals from Mostar at that time. During the war years, the society ceased its activities, but at the end of the war, on November 29, 1994, its activities were renewed under its current name. Today, the society has a large number of active members, manages two mountain huts, and actively organizes numerous activities for its members and the wider public. Traditional ascents, mountaineering schools, alpine courses, expert lectures, as well as various excursions and social gatherings, are just part of the story that continues the original idea - to show the world all the beauty and splendor of our mountains. The society also owns the





mountain hut Munika in the Blidinje Nature Park, which serves for accommodation and hosting various courses and lectures in the field of mountaineering.

MOUNTAIN STATION MOSTAR GUIDE

On May 27, 2015. with pleasure received news about the establishment and legal to the registration of the Station of Mountaineering Guides Mostar, non-profit association of citizens of which it is a part of life connected to the mountains. They directed their work towards information and education of mountaineers for guiding activity in mountaineering, protection and preserving the beauty of the mountains, supporting people's lives permanently settled in the mountains, organizing safe access to interesting ones mountain destinations and participation in creation of various projects and publications through which we want to contribute to the opening

of new ones possibilities of insight into the world of mountains.

PSD VILINAC JABLANICA

PSD Vilinac Jablanica is a mountaineering association that nurtures a centuriesold tradition of mountaineering in Bosnia and Herzegovina and is one of the oldest mountaineering associations in the country. They possess their own lodge at an altitude of 1961 meters, which is the only one of its kind in the Balkans inaccessible by vehicle. They provide accommodation and meals for visitors and organize mountaineering tours (both in summer and winter), ski touring trips to the mountains of Prenj and Čvrsnica. The lodge at Vilinac has a capacity of 27 sleeping places and is equipped with electricity. Next to the lodge, there is a source of drinking water, and warm meals and various beverages are available inside. Additionally, the association operates a guiding service with highly trained guides.



THE MOUNTAIN RESCUE SERVICES **ASSOCIATION IN BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA - GSSUBIH**

The Mountain Rescue Services Association in Bosnia and Herzegovina is a nonpartisan, non-governmental, and nonprofit organization. The primary goal of the Association is to create conditions for the development and improvement of organized and continuous work in all areas of rescuing people and property on land, water, underwater, and in inaccessible areas. The Association continuously works according to international recommendations and standards in educating and training rescuers to save human lives and property. The Mountain Rescue Services Association in Bosnia and Herzegovina is a member of:

• the International Commission for Alpine Rescue (ICAR)

• the European Cave Rescue Association

The mission of GSSuBiH is to create conditions for the development of the quality of all categories of rescue operations in inaccessible areas and to raise the level of safetu for all citizens of Bosnia and Herzegovina. It brings together all rescue services and clubs, non-governmental, and non-profit organizations engaged in rescue operations in inaccessible areas on land, underground, on water, and underwater in Bosnia and Herzegovina. Their desire and intention are to train and equip rescue teams that are ready to respond to all challenges on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. All members of GSSUBIH continuously undergo rigorous and demanding exercises and training to improve their knowledge and skills in assisting their fellow citizens.

Tourist tips

HOW TO DRESS?

Considering that the Blidinje Nature Park is located at 1200 meters above sea level, the weather conditions are often unpredictable, so it can happen that even in the middle of summer, temperatures are quite low. Guided by these facts, we advise you to bring suitable clothing for colder weather conditions alongside your seasonal attire. In autumn and spring, the mountains can also be very changeable and mostly rainy and cold, so long-sleeved clothing is indeed necessary, as well as waterproof footwear. Winter conditions in Blidinje can be extreme, with temperatures generally not rising above freezing, accompanied by strong winds and heavy snowfall. Therefore, it is essential to have appropriate clothing and footwear tailored to such weather conditions.

PARKING IN BLIDINJE NATURE PARK

Parking spaces are available within all hospitality and accommodation facilities in the Blidinje Nature Park, as well as at the Ski Center. There are no fees for the mentioned parking. Within our park, there is no public or any form of paid parking under video surveillance.

PROHIBITIONS IN BLIDINJE NATURE PARK

In the Blidinje Nature Park, it is strictly prohibited to light fires without authorization, engage in illegal dumping of waste, hunt, fish, or misuse natural resources in any way.


Administrative building of Blidinje Nature Park/Visitor center


